2009 Junior Angler Fishing Tournament

August 15, 2009



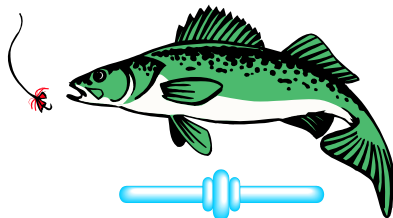
Again this year, since some of our junior anglers are not so “junior” anymore, we have a teen division. All teens, ages 13 through 19, are eligible to participate.

Rules for the *Junior Division* remain the same:

1. All children 12 and under are eligible to participate
2. ALL Anglers ***must*** be pre-registered by August 3rd—no exceptions please
3. Anglers’ meeting at Clubhouse at 8:45 AM, final weigh-in of fish at 2:00 PM on A Dock
4. Entry fee is \$0.25 per angler. This fee ***must be earned by the angler!***
5. Fishing is allowed from the dock or a boat, angler’s choice. All species of fish will be considered
6. No restrictions on the body of water that is fished, but anglers must depart from Olverson’s Marina at 9:00 AM and return by 2:00 PM for weigh-in
7. Awards to the Junior Anglers will be presented at the Function that evening

Rules for the *Teen Division* are as follows:

1. All children 13 through 19 are eligible to participate
2. All Anglers ***must*** be pre-registered by August 3rd---no exceptions, please
3. Anglers’ meeting at Clubhouse at 8:45 PM, final weigh-in of fish at 2:00 PM on A Dock
4. Entry fee is \$0.50 per angler. This fee ***must be earned by the angler!***
5. Fishing is allowed from the dock or a boat, angler’s choice. All species of fish will be considered
6. Nor restrictions on the body of water that is fished, but anglers must depart Olverson’s Marina at 9:00 AM and return by 2:00 PM for weigh-in
7. Awards to the Teen Anglers will be presented at the Function that evening

CUBAN TOASTIES

Ingredients

- | | |
|---|--------------------------------------|
| 1 1/2 ounces boiled deli ham slices, finely chopped | 1/3 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing |
| 3 ounces shredded Swiss cheese | 1/2 small onion, finely chopped |
| 1 baguette, cut into 1/3-inch-thick slices | 1 1/2 teaspoons chili sauce |
| 2 crisp dill pickles, thinly sliced or spice it up with jalapenos | 1 teaspoon yellow mustard |

Cooking Directions

- 1.Preheat the oven to 500 degrees F. In a small bowl, stir together the ham, cheese, mayonnaise, onion, chili sauce and mustard.
- 2.Arrange the bread slices on a foil-lined baking sheet. Place 2 pickle slices on each slice of bread, then spread about 1 tablespoon of the ham mixture on top. Bake the toasties for 8 to 10 minutes, until golden and bubbly. Cool for a few minutes before serving.

Yield: 5 servings

Editor Note: "A Cuban sandwich is a variation of a ham and cheese sandwich with a pickle originally created by Cuban workers, either in Cuba or in the immigrant community of Ybor City in Tampa, Florida. Later, Cubans brought it to other communities in southern Florida, particularly Key West and Miami where it is very popular. This is a quick and easy variation."
