7. The crabs must be 3 1/2" - 5" long.

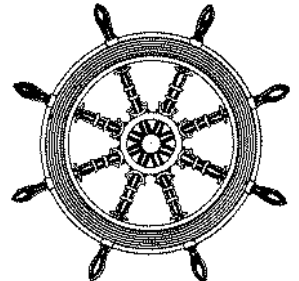
